## **ABSTRACT OF PAPER**

**Title of Paper:** TITLE OF PAPER (Maximum 10 words, all CAPS, concise and informative, avoid abbreviations and formulae where possible)

**Authors:** AB Author<sup>1</sup>, CD Author<sup>2</sup> & EF Author<sup>3</sup> (*Initials and surnames of all authors, presenting author underlined*)

**Company of Affiliation:** <sup>1</sup>Affiliation of AB Author, Country; <sup>2</sup>Affiliation of CD Author, Country; <sup>3</sup>Affiliation of EF Author, Country

**Corresponding Author:** AB Author, email address (*Initials, surname and email address of corresponding author, clearly indicating who will handle correspondence at all stages of refereeing and publication*)

## Abstract:

A structured, concise and factual abstract – 350 words maximum - is required. The abstract should be written in the provided font (Arial 11pt) and usually comprises 1 to 3 paragraphs of text with no headings, bullets or other special formatting. No figures should be included. An abstract for the IHHA conference outlines a scientific contribution related to the theme of the conference, namely *Inspiring innovative and resilient railways* 

The abstract should contain, as a minimum, the following:

- **Context**: What is the focus, context or scope of the research/work/case study?
- **Objective:** State the objective or scientific question that the research aims to answer.
- **Method:** Details on the method of research, i.e. field/laboratory tests, experimental setup, instrumentation or numerical modelling.
- **Results:** Typical or general results from the study/investigation/case study.
- Conclusions: A brief statement giving the most important outcome(s) of the work.

An abstract is often presented separately from the article, so it must be able to stand alone. For this reason, references should be avoided. Also, non-standard or uncommon abbreviations should be avoided, but if essential they must be defined at their first mention in the abstract itself. The abstract should also not contain any brand/product/company names and should be free of any commercial advertising.

A reminder that the templates can only be accepted via submissions to the online portal
